

Lakes Junior Cup Code of Conduct

The Lakes Junior Cup takes great pride in the quality of its players and host facilities. In order to continue to making the Lakes Junior Cup enjoyable for everyone we require all juniors to adhere to a set of guidelines known as the Code of Conduct. Its purpose is to help participants grow and mature by understanding and accepting the consequences of their actions.

Violations of Code of Conduct

Any for the following actions by a Junior Cup participate during a Cup event constitutes a violation of the Code of Conduct.

- Unsportsmanlike conduct, including abusive language, cheating, club throwing, disrespect to volunteers, officials or fellow competitors, or abuse of golf course property.
- Not adhering to the dress code at the host golf course.
- Use or association with drugs or alcohol, smoking or chewing tobacco products
- Physical abuse, threat of physical abuse or verbal abuse, slander or libel towards other players, parents, sponsors, host golf courses staff or members in any medium

Required Dress at the Golf Course

- Hats/visors must be worn with brim forward, males must remove hat/visor while indoors
- Men must wear collared shirts or mock turtlenecks and tucked in at all times
- Women's fashion shirts without a collar must have sleeves
- Women's shorts must be no more than 5" above the knee OR the inseam of the shorts must measure at least 5"

Prohibited Dress at the Golf Course

- Tank tops, t-shirts
- Denim shorts, short-shorts, cut-off shorts, gym shorts, jeans
- Earrings (males)
- Body Piercings
- Tattoos (must be covered)

Proper attire is required at all times at the golf course. Questionable attire will be reviewed by the Tournament Committee. Players in violation will not be allowed to tee off.
